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1. Using 3 concrete examples, argue the value of special symbols and punctuation.
 2. (a) Critically outline the meanings of and symbols for: (i) conjunction; (ii) negation; (iii) disjunction; and (iv) conditional statements and material implication.

(b) What other words other than “and” and “or” can play conjunctive and disjunctive roles respectively?
 3. (a) Use examples to identify 3 techniques used in proving the validity of arguments;

(b) List the pros and cons of each of the 3 techniques identified in (a) above.
 4. Explain the basis of the rule of replacement and illustrate at least 5 rules thereto with concrete examples.
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5. Define the argument forms in (a), (b), and (c) below and then use both truth tables and the formal proof of validity to test their validity:

(a) $p \supset q$

$\neg q$

therefore: $\neg p$

(b) $p \supset q$

$\neg p$

therefore: $\neg q$

(c) $(p \supset q) \vee (r \supset s)$

$(p \vee r)$

therefore: $(q \vee s)$

6. With concrete examples, critically explain the errors committed in: (a) the fallacy of affirming the consequent; (b) The fallacy of negating the antecedent.
